Finally, January arrived and with it the 107th Annual Meeting of the Illinois Association of Agricultural Fairs and the 58th Miss Illinois County Fair Queen Pageant at the Crown Plaza Hotel in Springfield. It was an exciting week.

Now this year wouldn't have been the same without help from some very important people, whom I would like to thank.

First, my thanks to the Lake County Fair board for all of their support and commitment to the fair and to this pageant. I think this is the best county fair in the world, and it is because of the men and women of our fair board and all that they do. I would also like to thank Alyce Brownlee, who continues to keep this pageant the great fair tradition that it is, and for all of her help. I would also like to thank the Callaway and Leetch families, and finally, my parents.

This fair holds a very special place in my heart and always will, because I've grown up here. From winning my first 4-H best of show ribbon, to riding a sheep, and watching my first demolition derby and motocross, the Lake County Fair is home to many of my most cherished memories. So thank you for a year that has given me even more great fair memories, and know that it has been a tremendous honor and privilege to serve as your 2016 Miss Lake County Fair Queen.



Welcome to the 2017 Lake County Fair Competitions! We are so excited to offer you hundreds of opportunities to participate and showcase your talents.

GENERAL INFORMATION

- Competitions are open to all Lake County and non-Lake County residents.
- If you have any questions about your specific department (judging criteria, presentation, etc), please contact the department Superintendent.
- Entries cannot be changed once they have been submitted. No refunds.

ENTRY FEES

- **Pavilions exhibitors** age 13 and older must pay a one-time fee of \$10.00 (includes one gate ticket), OR purchase a membership (18 or older only), OR purchase a season pass. Children 12 and under do not need to purchase a pass, but will need to purchase a ticket at the gate in order to gain entry to the Fair. An additional \$1.00 fee is charged for each Pavilions entry.

STEP BY STEP INSTRUCTIONS

STEP 1: Review the Pavilions General Information (page 7) and rules for your department

STEP 2: Entries open on Tuesday, June 6 at 9:00 a.m. Entries must be registered by Thursday, July 6 at 4:00 pm (in-office) or 11:59pm (online only) unless otherwise stated in the department rules.

There are three ways to enter:

Option #1: **ONLINE:** This is the easiest and fastest way to enter! Visit www.lcfair.com and click on the "Competitions" link on the Lake County Fair page. A credit card is required to enter online.

Option #2: **BY MAIL:** Fill out an entry form (entry forms can be downloaded from www.lcfair.com or are available at the Fair Office) and mail in your entry. Checks only. Mailed entries must be postmarked by Monday, July 2, 2017.

Option #3: **IN PERSON:** Fill out an entry form (entry forms can be downloaded from www.lcfair.com or are available at the Fair Office) and bring your entry form to the Fair Office Monday-Friday from 9am-3pm. Check or Cash only.

STEP 3: Pavilions Entry-Tag Pick-Up: An entry tag is required for each item.

Entry tags can be picked up from the Fair Office (located in the Event Center):

Saturday, July 22:	10:00am—1:00pm
Sunday, July 23:	10:00am—4:00pm

***PLEASE attach entry tags before getting in the Department drop-off lines.**

STEP 4: Premium checks will be available at the Fair Office from 5:00 p.m. - 7:00 p.m. on Sunday, July 30. All winners must sign for their check and have a social security number on file—no exceptions.

PAVILIONS: GENERAL INFORMATION AND REGULATIONS

1. **Entries open on Tuesday, June 6 at 9:00 a.m.** Entries must be registered by Thursday, July 6 at 4:00 pm (in-office) or 11:59pm (online only) unless otherwise stated in the department rules. Registration forms are available online at www.lcfair.com or at the Office. **Mailed entries must be postmarked no later than Monday, July 2, 2017.**
2. All Pavilions entries are \$1.00 each, unless otherwise stated.
3. **No entry forms may be changed once they have been submitted. NO REFUNDS.**
4. All Pavilions exhibitors must pay a one-time fee of \$10.00 (includes one single-day ticket), OR purchase a LCFA Membership for \$40.00, OR Season Ticket for \$35.00
5. Entry blanks must be legible and completed in full. Per IRS regulations, the exhibitor MUST provide a valid name (parents may not use their names on child's entries), address, zip code, and phone number on their entry blank. Social Security numbers will be required for any payouts over \$600.00
6. Entry tags and Season Tickets are not mailed and must be picked up before you deliver your entries.
7. Entries will only be accepted during the designated drop-off dates/times. Late entries will not be accepted.
8. An entry tag must accompany each exhibit. The bottom of the tag with your name must be folded during judging. AFTER JUDGING, ALL EXHIBITOR TAGS WILL BE OPENED AND EXHIBITORS' NAMES WILL BE DISPLAYED THROUGHOUT THE DURATION OF THE FAIR.
9. Pavilion exhibitors will report to the department Superintendent for location/placement of each exhibit.
10. General security will be provided throughout the period of the Fair, but the Lake County Fair Association and any of its agents, officers, directors or members will not be responsible for loss or damage to any property, nor will the Lake County Fair Association be held responsible for personal loss or injury from fire, theft or injury, or any other cause in connection with or during the Fair.
11. Not more than two monies will be paid in any one class to one exhibitor. **Premium checks will be available in the Expo Hall lobby from 5:00 - 7:00 p.m. on Sunday, July 30.** All winning exhibitors must sign for their check.
12. No Pavilion entries may be removed from the Fairgrounds until 6:00 p.m. on Sunday, July 30.
 - All exhibitors will need a gate ticket or season pass in order to pick-up their entries on Sunday, July 30.
 - Please bring your claim ticket to retrieve your entry.
 - **All entries must be claimed by 7:00 p.m. on Sunday, July 30. The Fair Office cannot take responsibility for any entries not picked up by 7:00 p.m. on Sunday, July 30.**
 - Pavilion competitors may not drive their vehicles on the Fairgrounds to retrieve their entries. Please bring assistance or a cart if you have multiple or heavy items. No exceptions.

7. The Superintendents have the right to reject any exhibit. Any exhibit which is not properly equipped for immediate hanging as specified in the framing section below may be rejected. 8. Each exhibit must be the original creation of the artist. Original artwork is defined as art created by the exhibitor and that copies no other artist’s work. Original works from following school assignment guidelines are acceptable.
9. All exhibits must be either framed or matted and equipped for hanging as follows:
 - **Framed:** Equipped with screw eyes and wire. No acrylic box or snap-together poster frames accepted.
 - **Matted:** Mat board must be used—no poster board or any other paper. All matted work must have must have braided picture wire (available at hardware stores) affixed to brass button brads which go through all layers of the matting material.
 - **Oils and Acrylic:** Must be framed and should be unglassed.
 - **Watercolors:** Must be framed, under glass or other transparent protective covering.
 - **Other Media:** Must be framed or matted—may be under transparent covering (Glass or Plexiglass)
 - **Novelty Art:** Must be equipped with screw eyes and braided picture hanging wire.
