How to Enter

LIVESTOCK COMPETITION ENTRY FEES

- ⇒ ENTRY FEE: \$5.00 per animal/entry
- ⇒ **STALL FEE**: \$5.00 per stall/pen Note: 4-H members also showing in Open Class must pay pen fees
- ⇒ LIVESTOCK PASS: \$35.00
 - All livestock exhibitors must purchase a "Livestock Pass" which includes 1 fair season pass wristband and 1 season parking pass for the West/Commercial lot.
 - 4-H members that are also showing in Open Class or Jr. Livestock must purchase a Livestock Pass
 - Only one (1) Livestock Pass may be purchased per exhibitor.
 - LCFA members do not need to purchase a Livestock Pass. Memberships can be purchased at Icfair.com
 - If you are a member and your child is entering Open Class or Jr. Livestock, they must still purchase a Livestock Pass in Showorks. The Livestock Pass will be issued in their name.

STEP BY STEP INSTRUCTIONS

STEP 1: REVIEW THE COMPETITIONS HANDBOOK

Read the show rules for each department you would like to enter and determine the DIVISION NUMBER and CLASS NUMBER for each entry

STEP 2: ENTER ONLINE

- ⇒ Entries are only accepted online.
- ⇒ Visit Icfair.com/livestock to enter online.
- ⇒ If you do not have access to a computer, need assistance entering online, or do not have a credit/debit card and wish to pay by check or cash, please call the Fair Office at (847) 680-7200 to schedule an appointment.
- ⇒ Online Entries **OPEN**: April 20 at 10:00 a.m.
- ⇒ Online Entries CLOSE: Saturday, June 1 at 11:59 for AUCTION, all others Sunday, June 30 at 11:59 p.m.

STEP 3: TAG PICK-UP & LIVESTOCK DELIVERY

Entry tags can be picked up from your superintendent on Tuesday, July 23 during animal drop-off.

⇒ Animal drop-off dates and times very per department

STEP 4: LIVESTOCK RELEASE & PREMIUM CHECK PICK-UP

- ⇒ Prize Money: Premium checks will not be released until the Department Superintendent has verified that your stall/pen is clean and free of all furniture and equipment. **Premium checks will be mailed the week of August 5**. All winners must have a social security number on file if prize winnings are \$600.00 or higher—no exceptions.
- ⇒ Livestock may not be removed prior to animal release time: Sunday 7/28 @ 5:00pm



General Information

- 1. Competitions are open to all Lake County and non-Lake County residents.
- 2. If you have any questions about your specific department (judging criteria, which division/class to enter, etc.), please contact the department Superintendent via the phone number/email listed
- 3. Entries cannot be changed or voided once they have been submitted. No refunds.
- 4. Any medications administered during the Fair must be with the approval of the Department Superintendent and the Fair Veterinarian.
- 5. All livestock must be delivered and arranged in place per the Livestock schedule.
- 6. No animal may be shown in more than one department—plus Jr. Livestock show
- 7. No exhibitors under five (5) years of age may exhibit in the livestock classes.
- 8. 4-H Club members are required to purchase a Livestock Pass, pay entry fees and stall/pen fees if they are showing in Open Class or Jr. Livestock.
- 9. Livestock vehicles must be parked in the designated parking area in the West/Commercial lot.
- 10. No equipment (wheelbarrows, lawn chairs, etc.) may be left in the walkways of livestock buildings at any time. Cattle Barn exhibitors are only allowed one fan per two head of cattle. Minimum of 12 gauge cord for all electrical needs.
- 11. If animals are being fed and cared for by someone other than the exhibitor, Superintendent must have name and telephone number of the caretaker.
- 12. All Champion Beef, Sheep, Swine & Goats (Open & 4-H) will be subject to drug testing. Random testing will be done on other selected market animals.
- 13. If any Exhibitor has their animal tested positive, auction money will be returned to Buyer and all expenses will be the sole responsibility of Exhibitor. The exhibitor will be banned from showing at the Lake County Fair for a period of three years.
- 14. Not more than two monies will be paid in any one class to one exhibitor.
- 15. General security will be provided throughout the period of the Fair, but the Lake County Fair Association and of any of its agents, officers, directors or members will not be responsible for loss or damage to any property, nor will the Lake County Fair Association be held responsible for personal loss or injury from fire, theft or injury to exhibitor of livestock, livestock, or any other cause in connection with or during the Fair.
- 16. Premium checks will not be released until the Department Superintendent has verified that your stall/pen is clean and free of all furniture and equipment.
- 17. RV/Camping is available Additional charges apply. More information can be found at: https://lcfair.com/camping
- 18. No appliances are allowed in the cattle barn.
- 19. Exhibitors shall adhere to the State of Illinois County Fair Exhibition Health Requirements as posted on Icfair.com

Livestock Delivery

 Animals not delivered within the designated times will not be accepted or judged.
- An entry tag must accompany each animal (receive from department Superintendent)
- Livestock exhibitors will report to the department Superintendent for stall assignments

AUCTION RULES



Lake County Fair Livestock Auction Saturday, July 27, 2024 @ 2:00pm Open Class & 4H Show

Restrictions and Qualifications:

- Open Steers: Any Steer weighing under 1000 lbs will not be able to consign to auction. Limited one (1) animal per exhibitor unless the exhibitor has Champion Reserve Champion. Any exhibitor that has Champion and Reserve Champion must sell both animals. No other tags allowed.
- Open Ewes/Wethers: Any market lamb less than 100 lbs will not be able to consign to auction.
 All wethers to be consigned will be Fair ear tagged before or during showing of the wether class.
 They must have the Fair ear tag in place at time of the sale and at delivery time to the buyer. No other tags allowed. Limited one (1) animal per exhibitor unless the exhibitor has Champion and Reserve Champion. Any exhibitor that has Champion or Reserve Champion may also sell one additional animal (total of two animals). No animals showing signs of prolapse will be allowed to sell.
- Market Swine: Market Swine less than 220 lbs or over 300 lbs will not be eligible to show or consign to auction. There will be a set number of 120 market swine to be sold. Included in the 120 market swine are 4-H, Lake County residents and a selected number from each weight class. Limited one (1) animal per exhibitor unless the exhibitor has Champion and Reserve Champion. Any exhibitor that has Champion or Reserve Champion may also sell one additional animal (total of two animals). Any market swine showing signs of scars or scar tissue will be disgualified from the sale. No other tags allowed.
- Goats: Market goats less than 75 lbs will not be eligible to show or consign to auction. Sale limited to the 4-H Champion and Reserved Champion Wether and Open Champion and Reserve Champion meat goat Wether or Doe.
- 1. The Superintendents and Auction Committee will check all consignment forms and animals to be sold. Any animal may be disqualified from sale for not meeting requirements.
- 2. The Champion and Reserve Champion market animals in the open class are required to be entered in the sale. Champion and Reserve Champion market animals in the 4-H Club classes are required to be consigned to the sale. However, they may only be pulled from the terminal auction if they have been tagged for Illinois State Fair and with the intention of showing their animal at the Illinois State Fair.
- 3. The 4-H Champions will sell first, followed by the Open Class Champions. The sale order for each animal will be made by drawing numbers, 4-H then Open.
- 4. All stock eligible for the sale must have been shown at the current Lake County Fair.
- 5. Exhibitors consigning animals to the sale must fill out a form furnished by the Lake County Fair Association. These forms must be in the hands of the Superintendent of your department by Thursday of the fair.

AUCTION RULES

- 6. The order of the Sale will be: Dairy Baskets Goats Beef Sheep Swine
- 7. The time for weighing the livestock will be at the discretion of the department Superintendent.
- 8. A fee of six (6) percent will be withheld from the sale price of each animal sold.
- 9. All animals entered in the sale and sold must be delivered to the holding area on Sunday at 5:00 p.m.
- 10. Any member of the immediate family of any exhibitor offering animals for the Auction Sale is prohibited from bidding on the same animal.
- 11. All market animals from the auction must be assembled in one location as designated by the Superintendent of the Barn. The owners of all animals offered for sale are responsible for the care of the animals until 5:00 p.m. on Sunday evening. No unethical practices will be allowed in the care or showing of animals or premiums will be withheld. Decisions of the Superintendent and Auction Committee will be final.
- 12. The decision of the Lake County Fair Auction Committee is final in selecting and screening of animals for weight, according to breed type, and also for conducting the animal sale.
- 13. The Lake County Animal Auction is a terminal sale. If the animals is to be shown again, it cannot be entered in the auction sale.
- 14. Each exhibitor <u>must be at their pen/stall</u> (or have a person at their pen/stall) on the day of the sale in order to sell their animal at auction. Each exhibitor must sell his or her own animal.
- 15. All Champion Beef, Sheep, Swine & Goats (Open & 4-H) will be subject to drug testing. Random testing will be done on other selected market animals. If any Exhibitor has their animal tested positive, auction money will be returned to Buyer and all expenses will be the sole responsibility of Exhibitor. The exhibitor will be banned from showing at the Lake County Fair for a period of three years.
- 16. Sellers' auction checks will be mailed 21 days after the last day of the Fair.





IAFE - International Association of Fair and Expos National Code of Show Ring Ethics

Exhibitors of animals at livestock events shall at all times deport themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their conduct in this competitive environment shall always reflect the highest standards of honor and dignity to promote the advancement of agricultural education. This code applies to junior as well as open class exhibitors who compete in structured classes of competition. This code applies to all livestock offered in any event at a livestock show. In addition to the "IAFE" National Code of Show Ring Ethics", fairs and livestock shows may have rules and regulations which they impose on the local, county, state, provincial and national levels.

All youth leaders working with junior exhibitors are under an affirmative responsibility to do more than avoid improper conduct or questionable acts. Their moral values must be so certain and positive that those younger and more pliable will be influenced by their fine example. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers and absolutely responsible persons who violate the code of ethics will forfeit premiums, awards and auction proceeds and shall be prohibited form future exhibition in accordance with the rules adopted by the respective fairs and livestock shows. Exhibitors who violate this code of ethics demean the integrity of all livestock exhibitors and should be prohibited from competition at all livestock shows in the United Sates and Canada.

The following is a list of guidelines for all exhibitors and all livestock in competitive events.

- 1. All exhibitors must present, upon request of fair and livestock show officials, proof of ownership, length of ownership and age of all animals entered. Misrepresentation of ownership, age, or any facts relating thereto is prohibited.
- Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers, or absolutely responsible persons shall provide animal health certificates from licensed veterinarians upon request by fair or livestock show officials.
- 3. Junior exhibitors are expected to care for and groom their animals while at the fairs or livestock shows.
- 4. Animals shall be presented to show events where they will enter the food chain free of violative drug residues. The act of entering an animal in a live-stock show is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitors, fitters, trainers and/or absolutely responsible person for show management to obtain any specimens of urine, saliva, blood, or other substances from the animal to be used in testing. Animals not entered in events, which culminates with the animal entering the food chain, shall not be administered drugs other than in accordance with federal, state, and provincial statutes, regulations and rules. If the laboratory report on the chemical analysis of saliva, urine, blood, or other sample taken from livestock indicates the presence of forbidden drugs or medications, this shall be prima facie evidence such substance has been administered to the animal either internally or externally. It is presumed that the sample of saliva, urine, blood, or other sample tested by the approved laboratory to which it is sent is the one taken from the animal in question, its integrity is preserved and all procedures of said collection and preservation, transfer to the laboratory pertains to the sample taken from the animal in question and correctly reflects the condition of the animal at the time the sample was taken, with burden of the owner, exhibitors, fitters, trainers or absolutely responsible person to prove otherwise at any hearing in regard to the matter conducted by the fair or livestock show premises, all treatment involving the use of drugs, and/or medications shall be administered by a licensed veterinarian.
- 5. Any surgical procedures or injection of any foreign substances or drug or the external application of any substance (irritant, counterirritant or similar substance) which could affect the animal's performance or alter its natural contour, conformation, or appearance, except external applications of substances to the hoofs or horns of animals which affect appearance only and except for surgical procedures performed by a duly licensed veterinarian for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal, is prohibited.
- 6. The use of showing and/or handling practices or devices such as striking animals to cause swelling, using electrical contrivance, or other similar practices are not acceptable and are prohibited.
- 7. Direct criticism or interference with the judge, fair or livestock show management, other exhibitors, breed representatives, or show officials before, during or after the competitive event is prohibited. In the furtherance of their official duty, all judges, fair and livestock show management, or other show officials shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation and respect and no person shall direct abusive or threatening conduct toward them.
- 8. No owner, exhibitors, fitters, trainers, or absolutely responsible person shall conspire with another person or persons by affirmative action or inaction to violate this code of ethics. Violation of this rule shall subject such individual to disciplinary action.
- 9. This application of this code of ethics provides for absolute responsibility for an animal's condition by an owner, exhibitors, fitter, trainer or participant whether or note he or she was actually instrumental in or had knowledge of the treatment of the animal in contravention of this code of ethics.
- 10. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitors, fitters, trainers, or absolutely responsible person to have any disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show against such individuals published in any publication of the International Association of Fairs and Expositions, including Fairs and Expositions and any special notice to members.
- 11. The act of entering of an animal in a fair or livestock show is the giving of verification by the owner, exhibitors, fitters, trainers or absolutely responsible person that he or she has read the IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics and understands the consequences of and penalties provided for actions prohibited by the code. It is further a consent that any action which contravenes these rules and is also in violation of federal, state, or provincial statutes, regulations, or rules may be released to appropriate law enforcement authorized with jurisdiction over such infractions.

Beef Cattle Show Rules and Special Instructions

- 1. Animals must be contained within their stalls. Exhibitors must provide side panels.
- 2. Equipment of any kind, including butt fans, wheelbarrows, lawn chairs, will not be allowed in the walkway. Only one fan allowed per two head of cattle. Minimum of 12 gauge cord for all electrical needs.
- 3. Exhibitors must have their STALLS AND ANIMALS cleaned by 9:00 a.m. daily.
- **4.** All trucks, trailers or other vehicle must be cleaned and disinfected before transporting beef cattle onto the fairgrounds.
- 5. Tie outs allowed—Exhibitor responsible to bring own tie out panels. Description and approval by Superintendent needed prior to Fair. Lake County Fair Association (LCFA) and any of its agents, officers, directors or members will not be responsible for loss or damage to any property, nor will LCFA be held responsible for personal loss or injury from fire, theft or injury to exhibitor of livestock, livestock, or any other cause in connection with or during the Fair.
- 6. All cattle must have neckties
- 7. Premium checks will not be released until the Department Superintendent has verified that your stall/pen is clean and free of all furniture and equipment. Premium checks will be mailed the week of August 5.

AGE CLASSIFICATIONS

- 1. Junior calf is one born January 1—April 1 of exhibit year. The calf must be at least 4 months old.
- 2. Senior calf is one born during the period of September 1 to December 31 of the preceding exhibit year.
- 3. Summer Yearling is one born May 1 to August 31 of year preceding exhibit year.
- 4. Junior Yearling is one born during January 1 to April 30 of year preceding exhibit year.
- 5. Senior Yearling is one born after September 1 of second year preceding exhibit year.
- 6. 2 year old is one born between January 1 to April 30, 2022.

Dairy Cattle Show Rules and Special Instructions

- 1. All animals exhibited must be recorded with their respective breed association in the name of the official exhibitor 30 days prior to the date of exhibition.
- 2. Those exhibitors who have no entries in the 4-H Dairy or Junior Livestock Dairy shows are allowed to delay bringing in their Open Show Dairy Cattle entries onto the fairgrounds. You must have your cattle on the grounds and be checked in by the Superintendent by 12:00 p.m. on Thursday and stay through the end of the fair on Sunday night. If you wish to come on Tuesday, with everyone else, you are encouraged to do so.
- 3. The fair will supply a vacuum pump for milking. Exhibitors are responsible for all other equipment. All milk will be dumped down the wash rack drain & rinsed thoroughly.
- 4. Display take down will not start before 4:00 p.m. on Sunday and no cattle will be released until 5:00 p.m. or at the OK of the Superintendent.
- 5. All trucks, trailers or any other vehicle must be cleaned and disinfected before transporting cattle onto the fairgrounds.
- 6. The Best of Show winner from the Open show will auction off a basket, decorated nicely and totaling about \$150 worth of dairy products, including gift certificates for dairy products and actual dairy products. The auction will be on Saturday. Your Supreme Champion dairy animal and this basket will be first in the auction ring and the basket will be auctioned off. Please see Lynn Doolittle for more information.
- 7. Premium checks will not be released until the Department Superintendent has verified that your stall/pen is clean and free of all furniture and equipment. Premium checks will be mailed the week of August 5.

Sheep Show Rules and Special Instructions

- 1. Registration papers for purebred stock must be shown to superintendent once animals are penned. If discrepancies between papers and animals found, said animals may not be exhibited and fee will not be refunded.
- 2. All animals must be registered as owned by the exhibitors at least 30 days prior to opening of the Fair.
- 3. Association ear tags or other ear tag numbers must appear in the health certificates. Owner's name must appear on each. Scrapie tags (Premise ID tag) must also be on each animal.
- 4. In judging sheep, breed standards as set by respective associations will be followed closely as possible.

Goat Show Rules and Special Instructions

The dairy show is sanctioned by the American Dairy Goat Association and their rules shall govern. These rules state that the exhibitor shall be the owner or owners whose name(s) appear as the owner on the registration or recordation certificate or stamped supplicate application.

- 1. There will be a separately sanctioned Junior and Senior dairy goat shows with separate championship legs given in each: Breed will be shown in order as listed in premium book.
- 2. Animals must meet State and County requirements: check general health requirements.
- 3. BY 10:00 P.M. TUESDAY: All registration papers are due and all goats (including goats entered in the milking competition) must be checked in with the Superintendent
- 4. Exhibitors please check in at the show ring in the back of the goat barn.
- 5. Age shall be computed from show date.
- 6. All dairy goats exhibited must be tattooed and registered with a recognized Registering Association and the certificate approved by the Superintendent in charge before entering the show ring. The original registration certificate is required for all animals 6 months of age or older. Animals under 6 months may show with the original registration certificate or with a duplicate application stamped by the ADGA office.
- 7. All goats must be properly fitted (clipped, clean, hoofs trimmed, etc) to be allowed to show.
- 8. Signed transfers will not be accepted as proof of ownership.
- 9. No pre-show milk out.
- 10. All animals must be penned. Pen space is to be utilized for animals only. This will be enforced. Pen size is 5x7 and will hold 2-3 mature animals. All pens must be cleaned at the end of the Fair. Premiums will be withheld until all pens are cleaned and violators may become ineligible to show at future Fairs.
- 11. All exhibitors must furnish own feed, bedding and equipment.
- 12. No vending of animal feed allowed in the barn.
- 13. Show order is subject to change as needed in order to keep the show moving.
- 14. Non-sanctioned Meat Goat Market Class. Limit of two champion meat goats to be consigned to auction. Final determination of entry into auction will be approved by the Livestock Committee to ensure high quality entries. Minimum weight for Meat Goat is 60 lbs. Market goats will be weighed and tagged. Market goats may not be shown in any breeding class as both wethers and does may be entered in the market class. Judging time to be determined by the Superintendent.
- 15. Premium checks will not be released until the Department Superintendent has verified that your stall/pen is clean and free of all furniture and equipment. Premium checks will be mailed the week of August 5.
